- * Hearing aids, cochlear implants, and listening devices
- * Stages of childhood development
- * Services available in local area

AVAILABLE SERVICES INCLUDE.....

- *Visits by qualified teachers who specialize in the education of young children with hearing loss
- *Visits by a Deaf Mentor to enhance family communication by modeling and teaching sign language.
- * Ensuring referral to Early Steps, Louisiana's early intervention system
- *Teaming with families and caregivers to enhance natural interaction and communication with their child by modeling and teaching language learning through daily activities
- *Collaboration with other professionals to meet the needs of children with hearing loss and their families
- *Helping families assess and monitor their child's language development
- *Provide opportunities for parent-toparent contact and networking
